Landscapes featured in 'Practice What You Teach'

"Practice What You Teach" is an exhibit of landscapes by 16 professional artists who teach in Colorado Community Colleges, while maintaining personal art careers. The exhibit is one in an ongoing series of Creative Capitol shows, sponsored at the Colorado State Capitol by the Colorado Council on the Arts.

Curated by Kathryn Charles (an arts professional who grew up in Littleton), the exhibit was made possible by Ralph Nagel, a philanthropic retired businessman, who is also a painter. His work has been exhibited in Arapahoe Community College's Colorado Gallery for the Arts.

"Practice What You Teach" will run through June 30 in the Lt. Governor's office and the basement rotunda of Colorado's State Capitol, where it will be seen by legislators, staff and many visitors.
